Abstract:

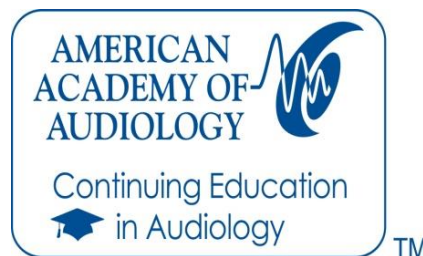
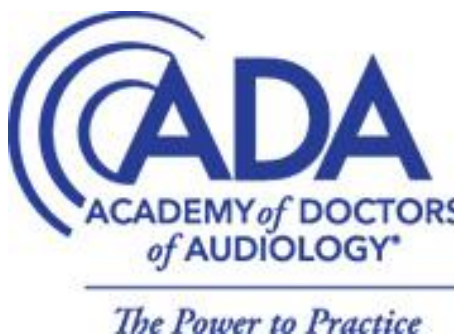
Healthcare models are evolving from an acute care (wait until it breaks) structure to a chronic care (prevent it from breaking) formation of care. The team based approach to optimal patient care requires all healthcare professionals to work at the top of their license and training.

Pharmacists have long been underutilized, especially in diabetes education, management and care. This session will review the scope and types of pharmacy practice, including community, hospital, primary and specialty care, in which pharmacists educate, manage and care for people with diabetes.
